I have been committed to patient care, teaching/education, and research. I have extensive experience in every aspect of even the most complex colorectal diseases and have served as a referral center for challenging pathologies that may be beyond the scope of many other hospitals. Comprehensive and interdisciplinary treatment in the management of advanced colon cancer, rectal cancer, and anal cancer (primary, recurrent cancers, palliative setting) are as much routine as are inflammatory bowel disease (ulcerative colitis, Crohn's disease), acute diverticulitis, functional disorders of the colon and rectum, and benign disorders of the anus. I have been instrumental and at the forefront in evaluating and adapting the newest technologies including robotic surgery, 3D-laparoscopic surgery, TEMS and advanced endoscopies, or sacral nerve stimulation and implants for fecal incontinence; I am one of few experts nationwide who understand and perform continent ileostomies and was instrumental in the development of the T-pouch. I am an expert for evaluation and treatment of fecal incontinence and not only offers sacral nerve stimulation but was also one of few surgeons who implanted the Artificial Bowel Sphincter or the magnetic ring (Fenix).

Major areas of research interest include: Colorectal Cancer, Hereditary Colorectal Cancer, Inflammatory Bowel Disease, Diverticulitis, and Fecal Incontinence and Pelvic Floor Dysfunction.

Scope of Clinical Practice

With a focus on the most complex colorectal diseases, the practice has evolved as a referral center for challenging pathologies that may be beyond the scope of many other hospitals (including UCLA, Stanford, MSKCC, MDAMC, and others). Comprehensive and interdisciplinary treatment in the management of advanced colon cancer, rectal cancer, and anal cancer (primary, recurrent cancers, palliative setting) are as much routine as are inflammatory bowel disease (ulcerative colitis, Crohn's disease), acute diverticulitis, functional disorders of the colon and rectum, and benign disorders of the anus. I have been instrumental and at the forefront in evaluating and adapting the newest technologies including robotic surgery, 3D-laparoscopic surgery, robotic TAMIS, TEMS and advanced endoscopies, or evaluation and treatment of fecal incontinence including sacral nerve stimulation and other implants (Artificial Bowel Sphincter or the magnetic ring (Fenix).

Research - Clinical Trials

A) Theoretical model development:

- 1) APPLICATION OF PHYSICS LAWS TO DEVELOP MODEL OF FECAL CONTINENCE FACTORS. Principal-Investigator. 2006-present. (5% effort).
Description: Fecal incontinence is a frequent and often difficult problem whose elements are not fully understood. There is not a single anophysiology parameter to predict dysfunction and guide treatment decisions. We therefore aim at applying the laws of physic to developing different models of the fecal control mechanism as an interaction between reservoir, evacuation, and resistance. Three theoretical models are being developed in analogy to the functions of flow, capacity, resistance, pressure: (1) exponential and linear model, (2) electrodynamic model, (3) hydrodynamic model.
- 2) PREOPERATIVE VERSUS POSTOPERATIVE RADIOTHERAPY FOR RECTAL CANCER – DECISION ANALYSIS AND OUTCOME PREDICTION USING A MODIFIED MARKOV MODEL. Principal-Investigator. 2006-2012. (5% effort).
Description: Reduction of local recurrences has been achieved by radiotherapy, but also by improved surgical technique (total mesorectal excision). Radiotherapy has adverse effects and cannot exceed local dose limits. Neoadjuvant radiotherapy may result in overtreatment. We aimed at defining the minimum local benefit that would have to be postulated in order to bring a benefit to the overall cohort. We hypothesized that reserving radiotherapy as treatment for a subset of patients with high risk tumors and local recurrences improves the outcome of the overall cohort. We therefore created a theoretical Markov state-transition model to simulate preoperative versus postoperative radiotherapy based on published recurrence rates with overall survival being the primary endpoint.
