The American College of Surgeons is working aggressively to stop Medicare payment cuts scheduled for January 1, 2021.

To continue to make our voices heard, we need to reach every Congressional office. If

you have already sent a letter via *SurgeonsVoice*, now is the time to send another one. Thanks to your outreach, we have contacted Congress more than 10,000 times in the past four months, but we need to keep the momentum going. We need your help to reach at least 20,000 to ensure Congress feels the pressure to act now to prevent the cuts.

Please take five minutes and gohere to write your member of Congress and urge your Representative to sign the letter led by Rep. Ami Bera MD (D-CA-07) and Rep. Larry Bucshon, MD, FACS (R-IN-08) to prevent cuts to Medicare payments for surgical services.
