BE-SAFE Evaluation

ASMBS and SAGES have worked together to develop a verification process, Bariatric Endoscopy Skill Acquisition Focused Evaluation (BE SAFE), for members to verify they have acquired the necessary skills to perform these procedures. Candidates are required to have performed at least 50 upper endoscopic procedures and then complete the (free) video curriculum before taking the qualifying written exam.
