





# Pioneer in Endoscopy Award

- The award is designated for a person in industry, or a physician/surgeon.
- The award will be given to an individual, not to a company.
- ▶ The award will be granted for a significant, long-term scientific or technological contribution to the field of surgical endoscopy.
- ▶ The award will not be given every year, but bestowed when the Board determines a worthy nominee. It is intended for those whose efforts have substantively changed and improved the field of endoscopy.
- One person may not receive the award twice, as it is for a body of work as opposed to an individual achievement.
- Past winners include: Karl Storz 1995, Bob Quint 1997, Robert Anderson 1999, William Chang and Richard Newman 2001, Kurt Semm 2002, Basil Hirshowitz 2003.

# The George Berci Lifetime Achievement Award in Endoscopic Surgery

- ▶ This is the highest honor SAGES bestows.
- It is bestowed for a lifetime contribution as an innovator in the field of endoscopic surgery which may be scientific, technological or educational.
- It is designated to be granted to an endoscopic surgeon who may or may not be a member of SAGES.



PLEASE DO NOT CALL ON ABSTRACT DEAD-LINE DAY to confirm receipt of your abstract. With 400-500 abstracts pouring in, there is no way to respond to these inquiries. Upon successful completion of the online submission, you should receive an automatic confirmation of receipt. If you are submitting a hard copy video submission, please send the abstract receipt confirmation postcard, and we will mail it back immediately to confirm receipt of your video.

# **Liaison Working Groups**

In order to better represent the voices of unique interest groups in endoscopic surgery, five existing SAGES committees and/or task forces will be re-structured. They will become liaison working groups with representation to all those committees which deal with issues and activities that impact their group. The committees/task forces in question are Bariatric, Ethics, International Relations, Pediatric and Rural Surgery.

Various members of these new liaison groups have been re-assigned to existing SAGES committees to represent the perspective of the interest group. These five liaison groups will function as "virtual" committees, accomplishing their work primarily through their designated representative to other committees.

President Dr. Swanstrom made this change to create a mechanism for specialty groups to work throughout the year, without adding to our already large number of committees. The Liaison Groups will work with the 2nd Vice President (Dr. Steven Wexner) to identify issues, then seek input from constituents as well as seek volunteers for projects. Administrative support will be available to help coordinate conference calls, contact lists, letters or e-mails.

In an attempt to make life easier for surgeons, SAGES has been establishing relationships with other societies of similar interests. One of the reasons for this is the concept of holding meetings jointly in order to reduce the burden and cost of traveling for our attendees and our industry partners. We have already had two meetings with the pediatric endoscopic surgeons of the IPEG Group. At the 2005 meeting in Florida, we will be meeting in conjunction with both the American Hepato-Pancreo-Biliary Association (AHPBA) and the Spring Meeting of the American College of Surgeons. The first is to communicate your thoughts about the meeting, particularly regarding new topics, themes, and other ways to make the next meeting even better. A good way to accomplish this is to respond to surveys that are sent out to you or that are available at the meeting. You should take every opportunity to use these tools. They are your voice in your society.

Another way to show support is to attend the meeting. Surprisingly, only a small percentage of the 4600+ SAGES members come to the meeting each year. Come and participate. You will be glad you did.

The annual meeting continues to be the most prominent of the many services that SAGES does each year for its membership. The future success of the meetings depends on the support of the membership and on the creativity of the Program Chairman and Program Committee who remain dedicated to keeping the meetings relevant, fun and user friendly.
